Welcome back to a new term in Year 5! We are entering 2025 and we look forward to all of the exciting learning opportunities it will provide. You have all worked so hard in the first third of your time in class 5 and should feel proud of your journey so far.

Our learning this half term is based around the theme 'Saving Our Environment'. For this, we will be reading the science-fiction story '**City of Rust**' by Gemma Fowler. It is not required for children to have their own copy but we highly recommend picking up a copy for home.

This half-term, **English** will consist of writing a story opening with action and writing a non-chronological report. In **Maths**, we will be continuing our work on fractions and begin to revise and expanded our knowledge around the formal methods of multiplication and division.

- In **Geography**, we will be considering the impact pollution has globally with a focus on air pollution and exploring what communities are doing to combat it.
- In **Science**, we will be learning about mixtures and solutions, then performing experiments to understand how we can separate them.
- In **Computing**, we will be interfacing with physical systems using Microbits.
- During **RE**, we will be discussing values and how both Humanists and Christians define theirs.
- In **Art**, we will be us using recycled materials to make our own sculptures whilst discovering the work of Josh Gluckstein.
- For **PSHE**, we will be looking at what it means to belong to a community, then later in the term, we will be furthering our understanding of misinformation and how to spot it.
- In **Music**, we will be continuing to learn our instrument – the Ukulele.
- Our sports in **Physical Education** this half term are dodgeball and dance.
- In **Spanish**, we will learn how to talk about the wider world.

**PE** this half term will be on a **Monday** and **Wednesday**. We ask that in the interest of health and safety your children come to school wearing their PE uniform on Monday and Wednesday **ONLY**. As the weather is still unpredictable, please use long bottoms and jumpers/hoodies/fleeces as part of their kit. Earrings must be removed before PE, preferably at home, and hair should be tied back if long.

Homework will go out every Friday to be submitted by the following Thursday. It will consist of one piece of maths, one piece of English and one set of spellings each week.
