


Dear Parents/Carers,

This half term, our class will be thinking about the key question, 'What is it like to live in Ilulissat?' We are really looking forward to reading this book together over the half term.



This half term, our learning will revolve around the key question.

We will look to do this in a number of subjects; in English we will be learning to entertain through our writing in the form of a short story, Design and Technology will be focused on taking an in depth look into how the people of Ilulissat dress appropriately for their climate and we will expand on our new found knowledge by creating our own red mitten. In Geography, we will be investigating life in Ilulissat and what it is like to live there.

To extend the children's learning further, we are continuing home learning projects. This home style of learning aims to:

- Provide opportunities for children to be creative and choose how they record.
- Provide opportunities for children to work independently on self-study.
- Enable children to research an area of knowledge linked to the topic which interested them.

For the homework project your child could:

- Create a tri or diorama about the Arctic.
- Crate an informative poster about the Arctic.
- Draw a picture of the animals in the Arctic.
- Write a description about the Arctic.

But overall, enjoy independent learning in any way they choose.

Children can present the information they research in any way they wish but there should just be one outcome each which shows what they have learnt about from their research.

The aim of the home learning project is to spend a little time each week over the next few weeks working on the project and bring the end result into school on **Monday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2025**. On **Tuesday 11<sup>th</sup> February 2025, straight after school**, we will then put the projects on display for everyone to share.

We are asking parents to spend time with their children, assisting the preparation and planning of the project, whilst discussing what they are learning and providing encouragement throughout.

We really hope you will enjoy supporting your child extend their learning at school further.
